2017 Annual Convention Lobbying Effort

A National Infrastructure Plan

- Support balanced package that includes direct funding for the Highway Trust Fund, water and other federal infrastructure programs with incentives for P3s;
- Build support for bipartisan letter urging longterm funding solution for the Highway Trust Fund (secured over 200 signatures).

Tax Reform

Balanced package that treats corporations and pass-through businesses equally.

ACEC Citizen Lobbyists

- Engineers are effective advocates you're problem solvers, and you work across infrastructure sectors and the built environment.
- Personal engagement is critical at the local, state and national levels:
 - ✓ Capitol fly-ins
 - ✓ Phone calls/letters
 - Visits with lawmakers in the district, town hall meetings

Political engagement is also critical – we won't win unless we help elect lawmakers on both sides of the aisle who agree with us on the issues we care about.

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Major Agenda Items

- President still driving the agenda, but stumbles and distractions diverting focus.
- Health Care Reform ACA "repeal and replace" bill passed the House, awaiting action on a separate Senate bill.
- Tax Reform discussions ongoing but the future is uncertain.
- Infrastructure done right, both parties want it; this could become the vehicle for other initiatives.

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FY'18 Budget Process

Trump budget proposal for FY 2018 includes cuts to major infrastructure programs:
 Transit capital investment grants – only existing projects, no new projects.
 TIGER multimodal grants – eliminated.

USDA rural water loans and grants – eliminated.

Army Corps of Engineers construction budget – reduced.

CDBG – eliminated.

Very cold reception on Capitol Hill.



President's Infrastructure Package

- FY'18 Budget package included outline of the President's infrastructure program:
 - \$1 trillion overall, with \$200 billion in federal spending; focus on "transformational" projects.
 - Incentives for P3s, regulatory reforms.
 - > TIFIA, WIFIA, expanded tolling, PABs.
 - > ATC "Corporatization"
- Expected launch this Summer into Fall.
- Congressional leaders continue to voice support for key ACEC priority: <u>additional direct federal</u> <u>funding.</u>



Tax Reform

- House Tax Reform Blueprint:
 - Lower rates: 20% C corporations; 25% passthroughs; 33% individuals.
 - Eliminates most tax credits and deductions; R&D retained.
 - Eliminates individual & corporate AMT, estate tax.
 - Full expensing/limits on interest deductibility.
 - "Border adjustability" approach incentivizes exports.
- Vehicle for infrastructure funding/financing.
- Tax reform more challenging than health care impact to infrastructure initiative?

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Transportation Agenda

FAST Act implementation:

- Monitor and disseminate info on FASTLANE freight grants, alternative finance/VMT pilot program, other opportunities.
 Promote implementation of streamlining reforms, putting
 - forward new ideas.
- ACEC remains focused on long-term funding.

FAA Reauthorization:

- Current program expires at the end of September.
- Key priorities -- funding, FAR requirements for airport projects, QBS expansion.
- State DOT FAR compliance.



Water, Energy Agenda

- ACEC, stakeholder groups pushing water for 2017 infrastructure package – funding for the State Revolving Fund (SRF) programs, WIFIA.
- Plastic pipe efforts at the state, federal levels.
- House, Senate to re-start push on energy bill.
- Administration actions to enhance energy markets – Keystone XL & Dakota Access pipeline projects – more to come.
- ACEC engaged on energy supply chain cyber security.
- Nearing completion of new Superfund study to support case for continued investment.



Regulatory Issues

- FLSA rule boosting the salary threshold for overtime to \$47,476 on hold pending court action, review by the Administration.
- "Blacklisting" rule repealed by Congress; new "blackball" effort underway in the states.
- Broad EPA regulatory review Trump Administration soliciting ideas for repeal/modification of regulations.

Waters of the US (wetlands) rule, Clean Power Plan (CPP), still on hold pending court challenges, likely re-done/discarded as part of Administration regulatory review.



Winning with ACEC/PAC

- Raised \$1,010,433 in 2016, nearly \$2 million for the cycle; 41 states made their 2016 PAC goal.
- 2015-16 Cycle PAC Disbursements totaled \$2 million as ACEC/PAC contributed to 318 House and Senate candidates and 23 political committees.
- Over \$500,000 raised to date in 2017; 8 states at Goal so far: IN, WI, HI, TN, MA, RI, DE and MT.
